

Immunizations are a requirement by state code for student enrollment in WV public (and private) schools. Lack of required immunizations can lead to the denial of a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) to prevent the possible spread of communicable diseases. October 2018 2018 Requirements for Pre-Kindergarten Program Enterers All children entering an approved pre-kindergarten ("Pre-K") classroom must have age appropriate immunizations¹ upon enrollment as mandated by state law.² The following chart shows the minimum number of doses for each vaccine required for entry.² Hepatitis B

West Virginia Immunization Requirements for New School Enterers State law and rules¹ require that all children entering school in West Virginia for the first time in grades K-12 must show proof of immunization against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps, rubella, varicella and hepatitis B unless properly medically exempted².
